FOCN45 CWWG 291300 SIGNIFICANT WEATHER DISCUSSION ISSUED BY THE PRAIRIE AND ARCTIC STORM PREDICTION CENTRE OF ENVIRONMENT CANADA AT 7:00 AM CST THURSDAY JANUARY 29 2015.

ALERTS AND STATEMENTS IN EFFECT... BLIZZARD WARNING FOR KUGLUKTUK AND REPULSE BAY. WINTER STORM WATCH FOR THE SOUTHERN KIVALLIQ. EXTREME COLD WARNING FOR THE SOUTHERN KIVALLIQ AS WELL AS POND INLET AND REGIONS AROUND LAKE ATHABASCA.

DISCUSSION... BROAD UPPER RIDGE OVER BC/AB AND UPPER TROUGH OVER NWRN ONTARIO. PLENTY OF LOW CLOUD ALONG WITH BITS OF LIGHT SNOW PERSIST OVER MUCH OF THE PRAIRIES TODAY AS COLDER AIR WORKS ITS WAY DOWN ASSOCIATED WITH AN ARCTIC HIGH PRESSURE RIDGE. THE ARCTIC FRONT LIES FROM THE CYPRESS HILLS TO NORTHERN BRITISH COLUMBIA AND A BAND OF THICK FOG HAS FORMED ALONG AND NORTHEAST OF THE FRONT. MANY REPORTS OF NEAR ZERO VISIBILITIES STRETCHING FROM CORONATION TO GRANDE PRAIRIE. BEHIND THE FRONT IN CLEAR AREAS TEMPERATURES ARE APPROACHING MINUS 40 SO ANY WIND THAT COMES UP IS CREATING EXTREME COLD CONDITIONS NEAR LAKE ATHABASCA. A WEAK LOW IS FORECAST TO DEVELOP IN THE ALBERTA PEACE COUNTRY THIS AFTERNOON AND TRACK SOUTHEAST TO AROUND LAKE OF THE WOODS BY FRIDAY EVENING. 2 TO 4 CM OF SNOW WILL ACCOMPANY THIS SYSTEM ONCE IT ENTERS SASKATCHEWAN, AND IT WILL BE FOLLOWED BY A YET STRONGER ARCTIC RIDGE COMING DOWN FROM THE MACKENZIE AS THE UPPER RIDGE STARTS TO RETROGRADE INTO THE EASTERN PACIFIC.

IN THE ARCTIC, THERE IS AN UPPER LOW OVER NORTHERN HUDSON BAY WITH A SURFACE REFLECTION NEAR CAPE DORSET. THERE IS ALSO A VERTICAL LOW OVER VICTORIA ISLAND. THE LATTER FEATURE WILL SWING SOUTHEASTWARD AND DUMBBELL WITH ITS EASTERN COUNTERPART OVER THE NEXT COUPLE OF DAYS. AS THIS OCCURS, THE STRONG NORTHWESTERLY GRADIENT CURRENTLY GIVING BLIZZARD CONDITIONS TO KUGLUKTUK WILL SPREAD SOUTHEASTWARD AND GIVE BLIZZARD CONDITIONS TO THE SOUTHERN KIVALLIO ON FRIDAY,

ALONG WITH PERSISTENT EXTREME WIND CHILLS. EXTREME WIND CHILL CONDITIONS HAVE BEEN OFF AND ON FOR SEVERAL DAYS AT POND INLET, AND THIS PATTERN WILL LIKELY CONTINUE.

OUTLOOK...POTENTIAL SYSTEM WILL AFFECT CENTRAL ALBERTA ON FRIDAY MOVING TO SOUTHERN SASKATCHEWAN BY SATURDAY. INITIAL FORECAST OF SNOWFALL AMOUNTS LOOKS TO BE IN THE 5-10 CM RANGE, HOWEVER MODELS ARE INDICATING THAT AREAS NEAR GRANDE PRAIRIE COULD SEE AMOUNTS APPROACHING 10 CENTIMETRES. AFTER THAT, COLD AIR WILL INVADE THE PRAIRIES.
